



Preparing to Visit the Wound Care Center®

- Call for an appointment. You may be asked a few questions about your wound and general health.
- Keep your appointment. It's the first step toward healing your wound.
- We're dedicated to helping you, but your cooperation is vital.
- Make a list of any allergies you have and any medications you're currently taking; including aspirin, vitamins and herbal products.
- Bring your medical records, and insurance cards and forms.
- If you have diabetes, bring snack food and medication with you.
- Your first visit will take some time.

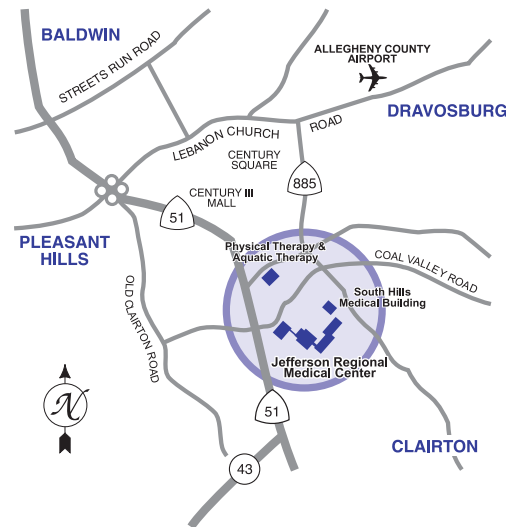
Jefferson Regional Medical Center is conveniently located just one mile from the Route 43/Route 51 Interchange in Jefferson Hills.

From the south: From the Mon Valley: take Route 43 North to Route 51 North. Turn right on Coal Valley road at the first traffic light on Route 51 (approximately one mile).

From the east: Take Route 376 West to the Boulevard of the Allies exit. At the fork, take the left lane to the Liberty Bridge and cross over to the Liberty Tunnel. At the tunnel's end, follow signs to Route 51 South (towards Uniontown). Follow approximately 10 miles to Coal Valley Road. Turn left onto Coal Valley Road.

From the west: Take Route 279 North to Route 51 South (towards Uniontown) immediately before entering the Fort Pitt Tunnels. Follow approximately 14 miles to Coal Valley Road. Turn left onto Coal Valley Road.

From the north: Take Route 79 South to 279 South. Take 579 South and follow signs to the Liberty Bridge and go through the Liberty Tunnel. At the tunnel's end, follow signs to Route 51 South (towards Uniontown). Follow approximately 10 miles to Coal Valley Road. Turn left onto Coal Valley Road.

Your First Visit

When you come in, our staff will evaluate your wound and general health. They'll also review your medical history. A blood test may be involved. You may also need special tests that give us information about blood flow in the wound area.

Your Healing Program

When your test results are in, we'll put together a treatment program based on your special needs. This program will include regular visits to the Wound Care Center to provide treatment, evaluate progress and make any changes that might be needed. You (or your caregiver) will be given detailed instructions in home care, dressing (bandage) changes and protecting the wound from further injury.

You're a Vital Part of the Program

Much of the success of your treatment depends on you. You must keep your appointments, follow directions carefully and watch your progress closely between visits. And any time you or your family members have questions, our staff is available. In fact, we encourage you to ask questions.



How the Wound Care Center Works with Your Doctor

The Wound Care Center works with your personal doctor, just like any other medical specialist. We'll discuss your treatment program with your doctor and keep him or her updated on your progress, unless instructed otherwise. Remember, you'll need to keep seeing your doctor for routine medical care.

Insurance Coverage

Many health plans cover Wound Care Center treatment. Your coverage depends on your specific plan. Be sure to bring your insurance cards with you when you visit the Wound Care Center.
